Parent Teacher Interviews

Our Parent / Teacher interviews are coming up in Week 4 (next week!), Monday 15th and Tuesday 16th August. These are optional for parents wanting to meet with the teacher for an update, or requested by the teacher if they would like to catch-up with particular parents.

These are an opportunity for parents to meet with the teacher as a follow-up to the mid-year report, to check in on progress and get feedback on their child's learning. It is a chance for parents to ask any questions they may have on any aspect of schooling. Interviews go for 10 minutes, and if a longer period is required this can be organised with the teacher.

With current regulations we have mask requirements with parents when inside, so all parents require masks. If you are unable to wear a mask for the interview, please contact your child's class teacher via Class Dojo or email to sort an interview over the phone, where the same information and discussions can be held. This is out of respect for the teachers, who will be sitting opposite multiple parents from different households - thank you in advance for your support.

Board Elections

We have had more than five nominations for the BoT, so we will be going to election. CES have been working over the weekend to create election documentation which will be emailed out to parents on Wednesday, this will explain how to vote online. For those who have not provided email address to the school, the information will be sent by mail. Please keep an eye on your spam/junk mail folders over the next few days too ensure you do not miss the opportunity to vote. Cut off for voting will be 4PM, Wednesday 7th September 2022.

Rural Bus Run

Last week the Ministry of Education held a meeting with Principals and BoTs around how schools should be operating their bus runs, and some potential changes that are happening. It was good to get some clarification around a few things, and the Ministry recommended informing / reminding parents of some aspects of how this scheme operates:

- <u>School Zones</u> are established effectively as geographical points on the map, usually at an equal distance between two schools. Some zones are a little more complicated and overlap, such as north of the Orari Bridge where at some points Woodbury School, Carew-Peel Forest and Geraldine Primary School all overlap. <u>This website</u> gives information around our school zone (below the map click "Show Zoning" to see zone).
- <u>Transport Entitlement Zones (TEZ's)</u> follow roads, rivers, etc... so are often different from a school zone. <u>This document</u> shows our School Zone and TEZ, you will see how they differ in parts.
- In a situation where school zones overlap and parents have a choice where to send their child, generally they are only entitled to transport assistance if they choose their <u>nearest</u> school. This means that while some children are entitled to attend a school, they are not entitled to support with transport. This is designed to encourage parents to send their child to the nearest school.
- If your child is in a TEZ they are eligible for transport via the school bus. Parents are responsible for getting their child to the designated stop, the same as parents in other places may need to drive their child a certain distance to get to school. If this stop is more than 2.4km away, the family can apply for a "Conveyance Allowance" (email the office to find out more about this).
- The Ministry of Education determine the bus run funding we get, based on the location of our children. They have set rules, which can be read in more detail on this document.
- Our Ritchies Town bus is entirely separate from the points listed above, as it is not funded by the Ministry. As a result we are able to pick-up / drop-off where we choose.

In the coming months it has been indicated that our Rural Bus Run will be reviewed, which could result in changes to funding and subsequently a change in routes. We will keep parents informed as to how this is progressing and any changes that may result.

Also, a reminder for all bus runs to be at the stop 5 mins before the expected bus arrival - any lateness has a flow-on effect at further stops down the line. Thank you.


