We are all immensely proud of the efforts of the students who participated in the Caroline Bay Relays in Timaru today. The students who ran did an awesome job of competing in the heat and the wind. They should all be extremely proud of their efforts, as it was a challenging event and tough running conditions. They all showed grit and determination and demonstrated outstanding teamwork and sportsmanship. It truly makes my heart sing to see the phenomenal support the students give to their peers, and we are lucky to have supportive whānau that turn up to cheer our students. It is also wonderful to see former Woodbury students who, when they were students at Woodbury, participated and come back each year to run.

For those whānau who haven't been part of this event before, it's a relay-style race with teams of four. Each team member completes a fairly fast 2km lap, starting from the Soundshell in Timaru. This is an optional event, and students can take part only if they wish and commit to training.

While there are Year 7/8 and Year 9/10 teams from various South Canterbury schools running at the same time, Woodbury students compete in the Year 5/6 category. It can be a very daunting experience, but our students always hold their own amongst the big kids. The event is primarily for Year 5 & 6 students, but in true Woodbury fashion, there are always a few keen Year 4 runners with quick legs who are eager to take part!

This year, we had four teams competing, and while all teams achieved amazing results, I would like to acknowledge the efforts of the Woodbury girls team of Charlotte Edge, Indi Richardson, Floss Harley, and Victoria Hurley, who won their event, beating 15 other schools. This is the 4th year in a row that one of our Y5/6 teams has won.
